We are very excited to now have access to Thompson Gale's Biography Resource Center. This comprehensive online biographical reference database covers information on more than 422,000 biographies from throughout history. around the world, and across all disciplines and subject areas. This information is gathered from more than 940 volumes of Thompson Gale sources, as well as full-text articles from nearly 300 magazines. This database is available at the library and from home, or via the Hills Memorial Library website at www.hillsml.lib.nh.us.

#### **Learning Express Library**

You've got to study for your SAT, GED, or College Entrance Exams and don't have much time. The LearningExpress Library database can help you out. This online service offers students and adults unlimited, 24/7 access to targeted skill-building interactive courses in



math, reading, and writing, as well as practice tests that prepare you for several types of exams including grade schools achievement tests, U.S. Citizenship, and civil service positions. Complete answer explanations accompany each response so that patrons understand why a particular answer is correct or incorrect. All practice tests include instant diagnostic score reports that help to target those skill areas that need the most attention. LearningExpress can also be accessed from any web-enabled computer in the library, office or at home. 
