New Automotive Database

The Library now has a subscription to EBSCO's online Auto Repair Reference Center. This database includes more than 150 easyto-read, illustrated auto repair manuals on all auto repair procedures for about 26,000 domestic and imported vehicles. Included are 100,000 enhanced wiring diagrams, technical service bulletins, and over 150,000 factory drawings with step -by-step photographs. Repair manuals for most vintage cars start back as far as 1945. You will also find Auto Care & Repair Tips which covers 33 topics on car care and maintenance, such as how to perform a tune-up. The Trouble Shooting section provides suggestions on what to check when diagnosing car problems, for instance, grinding brakes. Auto Repair Reference is updated regularly, so the information is always current.
