Nashua Area Artists Association Exhibit Exhibit: Through July Reception: Wednesday, July 10, 6 - 8:30PM



Museum and Attraction Discount Passes

Plan a day of adventure for less



The library has a large number of discount passes available for area attractions. These can all be **reserved online** in advance -- book early, as often only one pass is available for each location on a particular date.

Outdoor attractions include the Stone Zoo in Stoneham, MA; Franklin Park Zoo in Boston, MA;

Charmingfare Farm in Candia, NH; Squam Lakes Natural Science Center in Holderness, NH; Castle in the Clouds in Moultonborough, NH, and Canterbury Shaker Village in Canterbury, NH.

We also have many passes to indoor attractions on those days when you want to enjoy an air conditioned outing. Passes for the Boston Children's Museum, Museum of Science (Boston), Museum of Fine Arts (Boston), Children's Museum of NH (Dover, NH), Children's Discovery Museums (Acton, MA), SEE Science Center (Manchester), Currier Museum (Manchester), McAuliffe-Shepard Discovery Center (Concord, NH), Museum

of NH History (Concord, NH), and Wright Museum of WWII History (Wolfeboro, NH) are available. Please note that the New England Aquarium does not provide passes from July 1 - Labor Day.
