In April, the library community room will have an exhibit featuring works by members of the Photographer's Forum Camera Club of Nashua. This year we will have 16 members showing their work.




Meet some of the photographers and learn about the Photographer's Forum at a reception on Tuesday, April 5 from 6-8PM. Light refreshments will be served.
