Organic Gardens



Volunteers from the AARP will be at the library on Tuesdays from now until Tax Day (April 15) to help senior citizens and low to moderate income taxpayers of all ages with their tax returns.

Tax assistance volunteers do not, however, help

prepare Schedule C over \$10,000 in expenses, Schedule E, complicated/lengthy Schedule D forms without proper paperwork or other specialized forms. Taxpayers with complex tax forms are advised to seek paid tax help.
