

Starting February 1

Volunteers from the AARP will be at the library Mondays and Saturdays from February 1 - April 11 to help seniors and low to moderate taxpayers of all ages with their federal tax returns. (Tax assistance volunteers cannot help prepare Schedule C over \$10,000 in expenses, Schedule E, complicated/lengthy Schedule D forms



without proper paperwork, or other specialized forms. Taxpayers with complex tax needs are advised to seek paid tax help.)
