1940 Census - It's Here!

The 1940 U.S. Census release is the most significant record to be made available to genealogists since the 1930 census was released a decade ago. The 1940 census provides an economic snapshot during the time of the Great Depression and just before the onset of WWII. However, it will be quite a while before the 1940 census is indexed, so you'll need to do some research of your own. To help us with this,

Christine Sharbrough, a Certified Genealogist, will help us understand all the ins and outs of finding your ancestors in the 1940 census record. She will show you, step-by-step, where to start looking for your family, along with some interesting facts about the 1940 census.
