Native American Ancestry and Culture

Genealogy Club: Friday, March 9, 1:30PM

This month's genealogy club meeting will feature guest speaker Alfred "Chief" Johnson, who will give a presentation on Native American culture, life on a reservation, and his own family history. Born in Oklahoma, Mr. Johnson is a full-blooded Cherokee who was educated in Federal Indian Schools. A teacher noticed his gift as an artist and helped him to continue on to art school. As a well-known landscape artist, he has won awards for his illustrations, working first for Raytheon Co. and then for Sanders Associates in Nashua. He will be discussing his family genealogy as well as bringing some of his award-winning paintings and carvings.

Beading Group: Zulu Flowerette Chain Bracelet
